Tomten Pattern

Supplies:

- *thick felted wool approximately 1/4 inch thick– felted sweaters work well or I like Felt Works wool
- *White wool roving
- *Embroidery Floss
- *Small wood bead
- *Bigger needle
- *Scissors
- *Hot Glue Gun



*this is a free pattern– in the spirit of giving please do not use this for resale, but give all you want!

Step 1 Cut out the cone shape from the template– this can be adjusted bigger or smaller according to how big you would like your Tomten.



Step 2 Cut a small slit in the middle of the cone shape about 1/3 of the way up from the widest part of the cone. This will be where you insert the wool beard and attach the nose. A rotary cutter works great for this, but scissors will work as well.

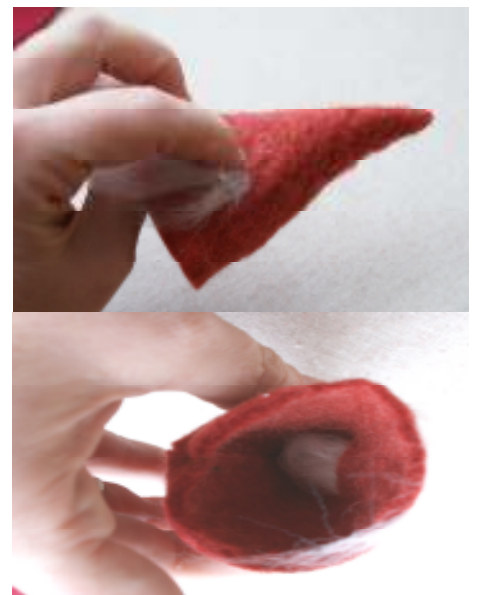
Step 3 Join the edges of the cone and stitch up the back of the cone. I find that separating out the embroidery floss and using two strands works well. I did a basic stitch from the bottom to the top. Once you reach the top, put the needle straight down into the top.

Step 4 Turn your cone inside out and knot off your last stitch and trim off the excess yarn.

Step 5 Pull off some strands of wool roving folded over, to the desired length you would like. Insert into your slit from the outside in.

Step 6 Open the slit slightly and attach the wood bead just under the flap to resemble a nose. You can secure this with hot glue or by stitching into place.

Step 7 Leave out some porrage and have some Tomten story fun!
